# MINUTES OF MEETING APRIL 25, 2019

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Herb called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and stated 'Adequate Notice of this meeting of April 25, 2019 has been given in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act by forwarding a notice of the date, time, and location of the meeting to the Express-Times and Star-Gazette; and by posting a copy thereof on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building and the township website. Formal action may be taken at this meeting. Public participation is encouraged. This agenda is subject to last minute additions and deletions by the White Township Committee'.

### FLAG SALUTE

The Mayor asked everyone to stand for the flag salute.

### **ROLL CALL**

Present: Mayor Herb, Committeeman Race and Committeewoman Collom, Clerk Kathleen Reinalda and Attorney Fina.

#### **2019 BUDGET ADOPTION**

Motion to open the Public Hearing made by Mrs. Collom, seconded by Mr. Race and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote. Being no comments, motion to close the Public Hearing made by Mrs. Collom, seconded by Mr. Race and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote. Motion to adopt the following Ordinance after Public Hearing made by Mrs. Collom, seconded by Mr. Race and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote. Herb – yes, Collom – yes, Race – yes. Motion carried.

## CALENDAR YEAR 2019 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of White in the County of Warren

finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2019 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$52,498 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS** the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of White, in the County of Warren, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2019 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of White shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$52,498 and that the CY 2019 municipal budget for the Township of White be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Township Auditor, John Mooney summarized the 2019 Municipal Budget. The budget contains an increase of three cents largely due to loss of landfill revenues. Motion made by Mrs. Collom, seconded by Mr. Race and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote to open the public hearing. Being no comments, motion to close the public hearing made by Mr. Race, seconded by Mrs. Collom and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote. Motion to adopt the 2019 Municipal Budget made by Mrs. Collom, seconded by Mr. Race and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote. Motion to adopt the 2019 Municipal Budget made by Mrs. Collom – yes, Race – yes. Motion carried. A complete copy of the 2019 Municipal Budget is on file in the office of the municipal clerk.

## **ENGINEERING UPDATE**

Engineer Sterbenz reported on the following:

- The township received a \$121,000 NJDOT grant to overlay a portion of Upper Sarepta Road. This project will be scheduled in 2020.
- The annual stormwater report was completed and submitted to the NJDEP April 1<sup>st</sup>.

- It was determined that in order to comply with ADA standards for an upcoming county road improvement, a section of Brookfield sidewalk, owned by White Township, will need to be removed. The sidewalk abruptly ends and does not connect to any other structures, therefore, it can be removed without any negative impact to the township.
- New stormwater regulations require owners of private detention basins to report maintenance activities to the township annually. Mr. Sterbenz began the outreach process last year and has only received one response. He will continue to pursue the required records.
- Mr. Sterbenz presented the 'Lot Grading and Land Disturbance Standards" ordinance amendment which was drafted at the Planning Board level. The purpose of the ordinance amendment is to keep drainage patterns the same when agricultural properties are regraded. Mr. Race said he felt the ordinance was too restrictive. The committee suggested sending the ordinance back to the Planning Board for further review.
- Mr. Sterbenz updated the committee on procedural issues he is encountering when reviewing zoning applications. Occasionally a determination needs to be made regarding Highlands exemptions. The state currently authorizes seventeen exemptions. Mr. Sterbenz asked whether the committee would prefer him to make the determination in his professional capacity, or send all applications requiring exemption to the state. The committee authorized Mr. Sterbenz to make the determination whether or not an application requires state review.
- Hope Crossing Road Project guiderail prices have significantly increased. This will require \$50,000 in additional funding to complete the entire road. The CFO will review the funds in the Capital Account.
- The Township received a request from JAINDL Land Company to consider passing a General Development Plan (GDP) Ordinance. Mr. Sterbenz briefly explained that the purpose of such an ordinance is to assist in guiding the developer through the application process. The committee referred the request to the Planning Board.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

John Chisemore, 38 Demeter Road, complained of drainage issues causing severe ice build-up on the road. Ellen Demeter, also a resident near the area, agreed. Engineer Sterbenz was asked to review the matter.

Elaine Reichart cautioned the committee that a General Development Plan Ordinance could possibly work against the town.

Dylan Schulze expressed concern about the JAINDL Land Company conceptual plan that was presented before the Planning Board. He suggested pollution and wildlife as areas of

concern.

## Ordinance 2019-02

## AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$115,200.00 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE GENERAL CAPITAL ACCOUNT IN CONNECTION WITH THE COSTS ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE HOPE CROSSING ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Committee of the Township of White, County of Warren, State of New

Jersey, has determined that it needs to appropriate the sum of \$115,200.00 from the Capital

Improvement Fund - General Capital Account in conjunction with the Hope Crossing Road

Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has been approved for a \$134,800.00 grant from the State of

New Jersey for such improvement project, which will be used in addition to the \$115,200.00 to

fund the project.

## NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the

Township of White, County of Warren and State of New Jersey that:

- 1. There are funds available in the Capital Improvement Fund of the General Capital Account in the Municipal Budget of the Township of White for costs attributable to the paving projects.
- 2. There is hereby appropriated the sum of up to \$115,200.00 from the Capital Improvement Fund of the General Capital Account in the Municipal Budget of the Township of White for the aforementioned purpose.
- 3. There is no debt authorized by this Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage following a public hearing to be conducted thereon and publication of notice of final passage with the requirements of law.
